NPC Annual Survey 2016-17

Highlights: Fast Facts

Membership: Size and scope

- 26 NPC member organizations report a total of 5,117,329 women currently initiated into our organizations. This represents a 3.03 percent increase from last year.
- 25 member organizations report 3,631,810 living alumnae representing a 0.5 percent increase.
 - » Of those living alumnae, 23 member organizations report that 362,592 are active in alumnae chapters for an 18.8 percent decrease.
 - 26 member organizations report 418,770 total undergraduates. This represents a 1.8 percent increase of the last academic year.
 - Member organizations report 3,347 collegiate chapters. That is up slightly (2 percent) from 3,283 chapters last year.
 - » 26 member organizations report that there were six colonies representing five member organizations.
 - » 26 member organizations report that 71 chapters were chartered in 2016-17. This is down slightly from 73 last year

representing a 2.7 percent decrease from the last academic year.

- » 26 member organizations report a grand total of 5,110 collegiate chapters ever chartered.
- 26 member organizations report 3,754 alumnae chapters currently
- 26 member organizations report a total of 7,375 alumnae chapters ever chartered.

Retention

- 26 NPC member organizations report 155,357 women were pledged into membership in the 2016-17 academic year.
 - » 26 member organizations report 150,713 of those women were initiated reflecting a 97 percent retention rate, up from last year's rate of 92 percent
 - 25 member organizations report 26,984 initiated members resigned from our organizations. This is an increase from last year when 24 member organizations reported 18,144 resignations.
 - 25 member organizations report 74,446 collegiate women graduated from college in the 2016-17 academic year.

Scholarships and Financial Assistance

- 25 member organizations report a total of 2,846 scholarships awarded » 25 NPC member organizations report a total of 2,222 scholarships awarded for undergraduate study.
 - » 25 member organizations report a total of 624 scholarships awarded for graduate study.
 - 25 NPC member organizations report a total of \$5,860,050 in scholarships awarded to members.

Philanthropy and Volunteering

- 25 member organizations report a total of \$34,093,349 raised for Inter/national philanthropy activity.
 - » 23 NPC member organizations report a total of \$25,143,897 raised among collegiate members for their inter/national philanthropies.
 - » 15 member organizations report a total of \$8,949,452 raised among alumnae members for their inter/national philanthropies.
 - 25 member organizations report a total of 2,484,069 hours volunteered for inter/national voluntary activity.
 - » 12 NPC member organizations report that collegiate members volunteered a total of 2,376,587 hours with our inter/national philanthropy partners.
 - » Nine member organizations report that alumnae members volunteered a total of 107,482 hours with our inter/national philanthropy partners.
